

ART HISTORY COURSE - B

The course is held at school and is taught in English. It can be started any week, the minimum enrollment is 2 weeks and the full program lasts 10 weeks.

This course is mainly addressed to those who can dedicate longer periods of time to the study of Art History.

The program concentrates in particular on the study of the period between 1200 and 1900, with focus on the Renaissance.

Lessons are conclusive of a topic, therefore students can start at any moment in the program. Classes are held twice a week, in the afternoon.

- The birth of Renaissance Sculpture and Architecture: Donatello, Brunelleschi and Alberti
- The first Renaissance Painting: Masaccio, Masolino, Fra Angelico and Filippo Lippi

- The Renaissance out of Florence: from Antonello da Messina to Andrea Mantegna
- Teachers of The Masters: Verrocchio, Ghirlandaio and Perugino
- Leonardo Da Vinci: The Universal Genius
- Michelangelo: The Agony and the Ecstasy
- Raphael: The Art of Divine Grace
- Titian and Giorgione: Pioneers of Color and Light
- Mannerism, The Art of Transition: Pontormo and Rosso Fiorentino
- The end of Mannerism, from Renaissance to Baroque: Parmigianino and Giulio Romano
